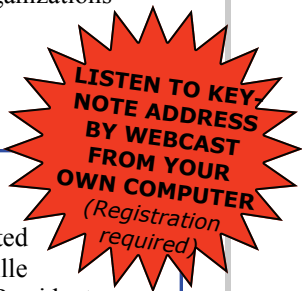

The Honourable, Dr. Carolyn Bennett, PC, MP for St. Paul's

Dr. Carolyn Bennett was first elected to the House of Commons in 1997 and has since represented the riding of St. Paul's. Prior to entering politics, Dr. Bennett was a family physician in Huntsville and Toronto. She received her certification in Family Medicine in 1976, and has served as the President of the Medical Staff Association of Women's College Hospital and Assistant Professor in the Department of Family and Community Medicine at the University of Toronto. Carolyn is also author of *"Kill or Cure? How Canadians Can Remake their Health Care System"*, published in 2000.
